

#### Dear Church Family,

I wanted to share some encouraging news and celebrate with you our commitment to mission.

The new normal is shaping up. In-person worship attendance has grown about 200% from the first day we "returned," and online participation has remained steady. It is difficult to evaluate online participation, but we may now be involving more people in worship than we did before the pandemic began. This becomes clear when we look at both in-person and online engagement. Youth groups are growing again, and children's ministry is experiencing growth that exceeds pre-pandemic numbers. In fact, the midweek children's program just hosted 35 kids last week (as I write this) and gathered their parents for dinner. We estimate that 300 children (or as many as 700 to 800 people in total) were involved in the Trunk-or-Treat neighborhood event. We're happy to see that newcomers and first-time visitors are once again gracing our worship services. Bible studies and small groups are slowly getting back into the swing of things. I also hope we'll soon be more involved with our ministry partners like Family Promise, Liberty Park Community Development Center, Mission Community Outreach Center, and more.

We continue to embrace safe practices. We wear masks. We sanitize surfaces. Also, as your pastor, I am encouraging everyone to get vaccinated if you can (I shared recently in worship why I believe vaccination is an act of discipleship. It is also an act of compassion to those who are not able to be vaccinated--like children and people with health limitations). Practices like these fit solidly with Christian values that put others before ourselves. These values come from biblical principles that can be uncomfortable, but as a church community we are all-in with loving our neighbors through these and other safeguards.

Numbers and safe practices are encouraging, but the story of our church is something very different right now. We have always understood that *growing active followers of Jesus Christ and building his community* is our most important mission. The pandemic, however, has even increased the conviction that our mission matters. That is because Jesus Christ matters most, regardless of numbers or programs. We are not focused on gathering crowds or caring for our building or piling on new programs. We are all about loving Jesus Christ and living out his mission (that is the point of our recent sermon series called *This Matters*).

May I invite you to rethink your involvement with Hamblen Church? Take a moment to consider what is important to you about our church community. It may be friendships, service, learning, having fun, or something else. We're a faithful community with a lot going on (and all of those things are great). However, now, in the new normal, we can refocus on what matters most. Consider these two questions:

- 1. How can your relationship with Hamblen Church be even more about your relationship with Jesus Christ?
- 2. How can being part of the Body of Christ at Hamblen equip you as a follower of Jesus?

This is what it is all about. We're not interested in just being a great church--even though I think we are. We are all about living for Jesus and living out his mission. I hope that is what the church is all about for you. If you'd like to take steps to make your church connection more meaningful to your discipleship, I'd love to chat. You can also talk to an elder, deacon, a small group leader, or a staff member.

This new normal can be a time for each of us to make Jesus Christ even more central to our experience of Hamblen Church.

## Congregational Meeting

Please join us for a brief congregational meeting on **December 12**, immediately following the worship service. We will elect elders, deacons, and (possibly) those who serve on special committees. We will also approve the pastor's housing allowance for 2022. We are not planning an online option for the meeting. (Note: At this meeting, we will not yet be looking at options for calling an Associate Pastor of Discipleship and Outreach. That will occur at our annual meeting in late January or early February. We'd like to wait for the results of the current stewardship campaign before bringing any questions before the congregation.)

# Please Pray for our Discernment and for the Associate Pastor Nominating Committee

A commission of session made up of elders JoAnn Grennell, Kyle Ham, Mike Aleman, Steve Watts, and Kay Steinhilber are meeting and inviting people to consider being nominated to the Associate Pastor Nominating Committee (APNC). We hope to present a slate of names to the congregation at our annual meeting in late January or early February. At that meeting the congregation may decide whether or not to call an Associate Pastor of Discipleship and Outreach and whether or not to elect an APNC. There are many factors for a congregation to consider. Our financial resources are, of course, one of those factors, and that will be discussed at the congregational meeting. There are also other options in bringing on a new associate pastor that can be discerned by a church session.

An APNC is basically a search team. They will connect with prospective candidates and then present a nominee to the congregation for a final vote. The work of the APNC can include reading candidate materials, conducting interviews, performing background checks, traveling for church visitations, and hosting candidates for guest weekends and neutral pulpit visits.

Please pray with us now as we begin discerning and look forward to possibly meeting our next Associate Pastor!

(Also, please be aware that the regular church nominating committee is at work right now. This team finds people to nominate for service as elders and deacons. They also fill some administrative roles. This means there are two "nominating" committees at work right now.)

The Pew Pads are back! We will again be passing the Pew Pads while seated comfortably in the Sanctuary. There is no need to register online nor stand in line to sign in on Sunday morning. See you there!

## Children's Christmas Joy Drive




